Agastache 'Apache Sunset'



Spikes of tubular flowers in rich shades of peach, orange, and rose provide striking contrast to the cool, silvery green, finely textured foliage. A heavy bloomer from June to October, superb for cutting and attracting bees, hummingbirds and butterflies.

Agastache 'Aprícot Spríte'



Apricot Sprite' is a splendid, long-blooming perennial filled with fragrance, soft color, and interesting texture. Its bicolor blooms of peachy apricot flute outwards on long, slender stems, attracting butterflies and hummingbirds. The fresh anise scent of the grayish-green lacy foliage intensifies in the summer heat. A pest- and disease-resistant and fuss-free North American native that deserves a place in every sunny border.

Agastache 'Arízona Sun'



In the sensational new Arizona series, Arizona Sun is a compact and uniform, 10-inch plant, with bright sunny yellow, mint-scented tubular flowers. Blooms in abundance throughout summer and into the fall. Hummingbirds and other pollinators love this carefree and drought tolerant plant.

Agastache Bolero'



Bring the easy care and pest resistance of traditional Agastache into your garden with this new longer-blooming, boldly colored form. Bolero' provides an endless show of color and scent. Licorice scented, deep bronze, lush foliage by midsummer is topped with rosy-purple tubular flowers enclosed in a purple calyx that persists through the fall. This aromatic is truly magnificent. Craving only sunshine and well-drained soil this plant will attract every honeybee, butterfly and hummingbird in the neighborhood.

Agastache 'Fragrant Delight'



A kaleidoscope of brilliant colors garnish this lovely delight. Tubular raspberry, lilac and orange flowers in summer and fall sit a top lacy, fragrant leaves on bushy 2 foot tall plants. Like other Agastache, the highly aromatic foliage is irresistible to butterflies, bees and hummingbirds.

Agastache 'Globetrotter'



This new Agastache has unusual lilac-pink flower spikes with carmine-red bracts, on upright stems flush with aromatic soft green leaves. Like other Agastache, it will reward you all summer and into the fall. Hummingbirds and other pollinators love this carefree and drought tolerant plant.

Agastache 'Raspberry Daquírí'



Vibrant raspberry red flowers, held atop blue-green wildly aromatic foliage on a compact, well-branched 10- to 12-inch tall plant make 'Raspberry Daiquiri' a great, bold choice for containers or the front of your perennial border. This drought-tolerant, carefree, enduring bloomer is an excellent choice for attracting birds, bees and beneficial insects to your garden from June until frost.

Agastache 'Tango'



Oodles of sizzling hot and brilliant orange-red trumpets embellish the 12 to 16 inch tall dark stalks of Tango from late spring into fall. Like all Agastaches, Tango is a good nectar producer that attracts hummingbirds, bees and butterflies. A compact habit with good branching when compared to other cultivars. The lacy umbrellas atop strong sturdy stems reach up to 4-feet tall, open chaste white, change to soft pink and finally deepen to a rich rose-red. A delicate filler for your perennial beds and borders that provides a lovely everlasting for your arrangements and bouquets.

Asclepías Incarnata 'Red Swamp Milkweed'



These locally sourced Milkweed seeds will provide native breeding habitat for monarchs and a valuable nectar source for butterflies, bees, and other beneficial insects. Plant these nomaintenance treasures in your garden, sit back, enjoy the pink blossoms, the frenzy of activity and know you've payed a role in habitat restoration!

Asclepías Specíosa 'Showy Mílkweed'



Also known as Showy Milkweed, compared to Common Milkweed the pinkish-purple flowers have longer, more elegant, tapered petals. Like all Asclepias, this drought-tolerant native is an excellent choice for attracting Monarch and Queen butterflies, hummingbirds and beneficials. A worthy addition to your butterfly garden or prairie meadow and a striking cut flower. Rhizomatous spreading.

Asclepías Tuberosa 'Butterfly Weed'



Commonly known as Butterfly Weed, Asclepias is a drought tolerant, native perennial with magnificent bright orange flowers concentrated in compact clusters atop branching stems. A non-stop bloomer from midsummer to autumn, the brightly colored flower clusters are followed by fruit and showy seed. The perfect choice for attracting butterflies and beneficial insects to your garden.

Bells of Ireland



This showy 2- to 3-foot tall plant produces blossom spikes of papery, apple green, bell-shaped calyxes enveloping small white flowers. An extremely long-lasting and striking addition to both cut and dried arrangements. In the vase, it's a perfect foil for more brightly colored annuals whilst adding form, structure, and interest in its own right. A self-sower that can usually be relied upon for years of successive blooms.

Blackberry Lily



This uncommon, easy-care perennial, too seldom seen in American gardens, features the foliage of an Iris, the blooms of a Lily, and unusual glossy black berries that form in clusters when its seedpods split open in fall. Long-blooming and very easy to grow, it is a fine addition to any planting. The jazzy, unusual blooms arriving mid-summer are borne at the end of long, wiry stems, reach 2 inches wide and have a rich orange base and liberal scarlet speckles. Fascinating to behold in the garden and often brought indoors for arrangements.

Bottle Gentian



Named by the Massachusetts Natural Heritage § Endangered Species Program, Bottle Gentian is an unusual wildflower that prefers a moist, rich soil. Atop the stems are clusters of striking, deep blue flowers that never actually open, giving them their bottle-like appearance. The mature blooms are pollinated exclusively by bumblebees, which pry open the flowers to gain entry into the inner sanctum. This unusual perennial is slow-growing, but long-lived and requires little care once established.

Calamintha nepeta 'Blue Marvelette'



A Fleuroselect 2016 Gold Medal winner offering masses of enduring, striking, purple-blue flowers in profusion on upright spikes held above minty green foliage. This compact Catmint, beloved by bees and butterflies, is an outstanding garden performer — easy, reliable and does not spread like other mint. Bring color and fragrance to your sunny border, walkways, patios and containers.

Castor Bean 'New Zealand Purple'



A unique and uncommon variety, the New Zealand castor bean plant has enormous, deeply lobed, rich metallic bronze-purple leaves that seems to shimmer in the sun. One of the more showy specimens, its foliage, stems, and even seed pods are a deep purple. This variety will grow to 6- to 8-feet tall and produce red blooms in late summer and early fall. Grown as a big leafy specimen or as background plants, this lovely castor bean variety will add a fabulous tropical dimension to your garden. Seeds are highly poisonous.

White Queen Cleome



An old fashioned favorite, also known as Spider Flower, cleome's large airy flowers bloom atop sturdy 4 foot stalks. A very stately centerpiece in the garden or as a cut flower for large arrangements. If pinched when about 6 inches tall, each plant will branch out to produce a half dozen or more blooms. A bright clean white.

Violet Queen Cleome

Marigold 'Bambino'



A petite French Marigold with lively variegated petals of dark and light orange that swirl around a center button, giving the effect of a tiny circus tent. Verbena Bonariensis

Xeranthemum Double Míx

Benary's Giant Lime Zinnia

This recommendation by the Association of Specialty Cut Flower Growers yields masses of long, sturdy stems with 3- to 4-inch, fully double, dahlia-like chartreuse blooms. These are outstanding massed in the landscape, holding up well in summer heat and rain, and jaw-dropping in in mixed bouquets with an excellent vase life.

Zínnía Magellan Ivory
