Castor Bean - <i>Ricinus Communis</i>		Castor Bean - <i>Carmentia Red</i>	
	A specimen foliage plant that is exotic, magnificent and tropical in appearance. Grows to 6 to 10 feet and bears large, deep green leaves embossed with deep red veins. Produces bright pink flower buds and attractive bright pink seed pods which add dramatic flare to the landscape.		Fast-growing with iridescent wine-colored foliage, red stems, bright red pods. Iridescent wine-colored foliage, red stems, bright red pods. Can be grown in large containers. Brilliantly colored seed pods make an exotic cut flower. Perennial in zones 8-10.
Hyacinth Bean Ruby Moon		Blue Lace Flower	
	Award-winner with color all season. Green and wine-colored foliage, purple stems, lilac-rose blossoms and shiny, magenta pods (2-3"). While all parts of the plant are edible, it is recommended that the mature seeds be boiled before eating; used in Asian, Thai and Indian cooking. Useful as cut flowers; pods may also be dried.		One of the finest of all cut flowers, the Blue Lace Flower produces beautiful, light blue blossoms which closely resemble Queen Anne's Lace. The flowers are borne on 24-30 inch stems of feathery foliage. Long blooming period.
Purple Belle <i>Cerinthe</i>		<i>Cobea Alba</i>	
	Half-hardy Perennial, usually grown as an annual which will flower from June to frost. The pendulous, bell-shaped magenta blooms atop blue-green oval leaves make this an attention getting cut flower.		Spectacular climbing plant for the summer garden. The flowers are greenish on opening, later turning into a creamy white. The presentation of 2" bell-shaped flowers give rise to the common names, cup and saucer or cathedral bells. Will appeal to anyone who longs for sensual impact. Extremely attractive & aromatic when scrambling upward through trellis work, archways, over small fixtures and old trees.
Violet Queen <i>Cleome</i>		White Queen <i>Cleome</i>	
	An old fashioned favorite, also known as Spider Flower, cleome's large airy flowers bloom atop sturdy 4 foot stalks. A very stately centerpiece in the garden or as a cut flower for large arrangements. If pinched when about 6 inches tall, each plant will branch out to produce a half dozen or more blooms. A very pretty lavender.		An old fashioned favorite, also known as Spider Flower, cleome's large airy flowers bloom atop sturdy 4 foot stalks. A very stately centerpiece in the garden or as a cut flower for large arrangements. If pinched when about 6 inches tall, each plant will branch out to produce a half dozen or more blooms. Only a foot tall, these new cosmos with semi double 1 1/2" blooms in vibrant single shades of lemon, orange and red will add a splash of color to the veggie garden or make an eye-catching addition to front of your favorite flower bed or container garden.
Black Currant Swirl <i>Datura</i>		Cheyenne Spirit <i>Echinacea</i>	
	Large double frilled blooms in gorgeous shades of blackcurrant and lilac unfurl in abundance on 5 foot tall plants.		A stunning first-year flowering echinacea with hues ranging from rich purple to pink, red, salmon, yellows, creams and white. The abundant flowers grace the top of well branched, durable plants. Well suited to your perennial border, a mass landscape planting, a butterfly garden or as a cut flower.
Globe Amaranth 'QIS Orange'		Kilimanjaro White Marigold	
	unique orange Gomphrena. Masses of delightful little clover-blossom shaped flowers on upright spikes. Resilient bloomers from summer through frost in all weather conditions.		Dwarf bushy marigold with lovely 2-inch double, creamy-white blooms atop 18" plants.

	Green and white variegated foliage. Improved strain of brilliant, single, 2" flowers in yellow, crimson, orange, salmon and cherry. Compact, mound-shaped plants. Both leaves and flowers are edible with a peppery zing.		The blending of pastels and bicolors in delicious shades of strawberry, raspberry, apricot, and cream. Malva Zebrina		Nigella Damascena - Love in A Mist	
	A fascinating heirloom cottage garden plant with lavender-pink petals and exotic maroon veins that is very long blooming. This striking, out of the ordinary plant grows to 3-4 feet.		Bears fine, threadlike foliage and handsome pink, blue & white 1.5" flowers. Blooms appear mainly in May and June, and sporadically throughout the summer. An excellent cut flower. The season culminates with attractive horned green seedpods that change to cream and burgundy over time. Dried seed heads are beautiful for winter arrangements.

	The most fragrant selection available of long-stemmed cutting varieties. Wavy petaled and in a mix of colors. Grow on a trellis		An award winning fragrant variety from England with long stems and wavy petals of cream edged in deep pink.
Sweet Pea 'Cupani's Original'		Chim Chiminee Rudbeckia	
	A fragrant bicolor in rich colors of purple and deep blue.		This mid-sized variety is a standout due to its very unusual narrow or quilled petals surrounding a brown cone. Flowers are in rustic shades of yellow, gold, orange and mahogany red. A mass of blooms from July to frost. Half-hardy perennial. Often survives a few winters, or at least self seeds.
Irish Eyes Rudbeckia		Autumn Colors Rudbeckia	
	This tall strain produces large, single golden-yellow daisies with a lime green eye. These perky flowers will make you smile on even the gloomiest day. Half-hardy perennial. Often survives a few winters, or at least self seeds.		The bronze petals, red rings, and dark rust centers of this eye-catching variety make a vivid display of fall colors. What's not to love about attractive 5" flowers for months on end. An outstanding cut flower. Half-hardy perennial. Often survives a few winters, or at least self seeds.

Prairie Sun Rudbeckia  <p>A 2003 All America Selection. Quite different in appearance from other Rudbeckias. It has a light green center with sunny yellow petals edged with a lighter shade of yellow. Plants grow to about 3' in height and blooms can be as large as 5" across. Can provide high quality cut flowers. Half-hardy perennial. Often survives a few winters, or at least self-seeds.</p>	Bolero Mix Salpiglossis  <p>Also known as "Painted Tongue," these 2 1/2' multi-branching plants boast eye-catching velvety trumpets in a range of extravagant colors and bicolors. The colorful petals are accented by contrasting veins and marbled patterns. Bolero is noted to be superior in handling the summer stresses, blooming for the entire season.</p>		
Italian White Sunflower  <p>A.k.a. Italian Greenheart, this unique multi-branching sunflower has creamy white, daisy-like, pointed petals with contrasting green to black centers. Grows 4 ft to 6 ft tall</p>	Fantasia Mix Sunflower  <p>Mix offered by Pinetree for the widest possible color range - goes from white, lemon, and yellow all the way to a very dark red including many bi-colors in between. What could be better than a splash of sunshine and color in the form of 5" pollenless blooms atop five foot tall single stem and branching plants?</p>		
Maximilian Sunflower  <p>Masses of large, showy yellow-gold blooms occur throughout the full 5-10' height of this plant during late summer and fall. A wild species that is excellent for back borders and bouquets.</p>	Lemon Aura Sunflower  <p>A beautiful and unique starburst type, with semi-double flowers in pale yellow with a subtle green center. 5' tall, well-branched plants produce 6" pollenless blooms.</p>		
Tassel Flower 'Irish Poet'  <p>RARE - The rediscovered light orange form of tassel flower, almost lost in the last 20 years. Little tufted paintbrush blossoms dance on the tops of curvy stems. Great in masses, or weaving among other annuals. Self sows.</p>	Sole D Oro Sunflower  <p>These branching, 4 ft tall plants are covered with large, golden yellow, fully double blooms from July through the season's end.</p>		
Torch Tithonia  <p>Best Tithonia for cutting. 3 1/2" wide flowers on strong branching plants with velvety dark green leaves. Blooms midsummer to frost. Loves hot dry sites. Once you have Tithonia in your garden, it's hard to live without!</p>	Fiesta Del Sol Tithonia  <p>A dwarf variety of the ever-popular Tithonia. Intense, bright orange 2-3" daisy-like flowers cover these 28-30" plants all season long. A favorite of hummingbirds and butterflies and excellent for cut flowers.</p>		
Zinnia 'Senorita'  <p>Warm salmon-pink petals are curled at the tips and have an attractive tousled look. Welcome in the garden bed and also lovely for bouquets.</p>	Bonariensis Verbena  <p>This well-loved beauty makes an architectural statement with rich lilac-purple flower clusters floating atop slender, willowy stems that stand un-staked up to 6 feet tall. Good see-through plant for a splash of color and in mass plantings.</p>
