Agastache 'Apache Sunset'



Spikes of tubular flowers in rich shades of peach, orange, and rose provide striking contrast to the cool, silvery green, finely textured foliage. The leaves are profoundly aromatic, with scents akin to anise, mint or even root beer, depending on your olfactory inclination. A heavy bloomer from June to October, superb for cutting and attracting bees, hummingbirds and butterflies.

Agastache 'Aprícot Spríte'



Apricot Sprite' is a splendid, long-blooming perennial filled with fragrance, soft color, and interesting texture. Its bicolor blooms of peachy apricot flute outwards on long, slender stems, attracting butterflies and hummingbirds. The fresh anise scent of the grayish-green lacy foliage intensifies in the summer heat. A pest- and disease-resistant and fuss-free North American native that deserves a place in every sunny border.

Agastache 'Arizona Sun'



In the sensational new Arizona series, Arizona Sun is a compact and uniform, 10-inch plant, with bright sunny yellow, mint-scented tubular flowers. Blooms in abundance throughout summer and into the fall. Hummingbirds and other pollinators love this carefree and drought tolerant plant.

Agastache 'Arizona Sunset'



In the sensational new Arizona series, Arizona Sunset is a compact and uniform, 10-inch plant with licorice-scented, gray-green foliage. Peachy pink buds open to lavender pink tubular blooms on this very floriferous cultivar. Like other Agastache, Hummingbirds and other pollinators love this carefree and drought tolerant plant.

Agastache 'Astello Indígo'



This European award-winner is an exciting breakthrough. Finally an Agastache than lends itself equally well to containers as to your mixed borders. The beautiful deep blue spikes stand 20 inches high and are held over dark green foliage and exude a minty fragrance. The spikes persist from midsummer through fall and are irresistible to butterflies and bees. A carefree joy, Indigo is stunning when planted 'en masse' in borders or landscape plantings.

Agastache 'Asturo Whíte'



A fresh combination of mint-scented, pure white flowers with contrasting bright green calyxes make this dwarf hybrid stand out from other Agastaches. This Fleuroselect Novelty Award Winner blooms mid-summer through fall, and like other Agastaches, strongly attracts hummingbirds, bees, and butterflies.

Agastache 'Fragrant Delight'



A kaleidoscope of brilliant colors garnish this lovely delight. Tubular raspberry, lilac and orange flowers in summer and fall sit a top lacy, fragrant leaves on bushy 2 foot tall plants. Like other Agastache, the highly aromatic foliage is irresistible to butterflies, bees and hummingbirds.

Agastache 'Sangría'



This garden-worthy Hyssop is topped with a flourish by upright spires of pink-crimson flowers from July to October. As a bonus, the unique and refreshing lemon-scented foliage can be brewed for a one-of-a kind tea! Excellent plant for attracting birds, bees, and beneficial insects to your garden.

Agastache 'Tango'



Oodles of sizzling hot and brilliant orange-red trumpets embellish the 12 to 16 inch tall dark stalks of Tango from late spring into fall. Like all Agastaches, Tango is a good nectar producer that attracts hummingbirds, bees and butterflies. A compact habit with good branching when compared to other cultivars. A great choice for containers, and one may not be enough. It takes two to tango!

Asclepías Tuberosa



Commonly known as Butterfly Weed, Asclepias is a drought tolerant, native perennial with magnificent bright orange flowers concentrated in compact clusters atop branching stems. A non-stop bloomer from midsummer to autumn, the brightly colored flower clusters are followed by fruit and showy seed. The perfect choice for attracting butterflies and beneficial insects to your garden.

Argostemma Ocean Pearls



A cottage garden staple that is the epitome of grace and charm. Pure white, 2- to 3-inch trumpet shaped flowers sport intriguing black dotted lines, akin to nectar guides, deep in their throats. Extremely floriferous and playful, with sprays of blooms on slender, upright stems that dance in the breeze. An easy-to-grow, self-sowing annual that makes glorious cut flowers and doesn't need pampering.

Bells of Ireland



This showy 2- to 3-foot tall plant produces blossom spikes of papery, apple green, bell-shaped calyxes enveloping small white flowers. An extremely long-lasting and striking addition to both cut and dried arrangements. In the vase, it's a perfect foil for more brightly colored annuals whilst adding form, structure, and interest in its own right. A self-sower that can usually be relied upon for years of successive blooms.

Blackberry Lily



This uncommon, easy-care perennial, too seldom seen in American gardens, features the foliage of an Iris, the blooms of a Lily, and unusual glossy black berries that form in clusters when its seedpods split open in fall. Long-blooming and very easy to grow, it is a fine addition to any planting. The jazzy, unusual blooms arriving mid-summer are borne at the end of long, wiry stems, reach 2 inches wide and have a rich orange base and liberal scarlet speckles. Fascinating to behold in the garden and often brought indoors for arrangements.

Bottle Gentían



Named by the Massachusetts Natural Heritage § Endangered Species Program, Bottle Gentian is an unusual wildflower that prefers a moist, rich soil. Atop the stems are clusters of striking, deep blue flowers that never actually open, giving them their bottle-like appearance. The mature blooms are pollinated exclusively by bumblebees, which pry open the flowers to gain entry into the inner sanctum. This unusual perennial is slow-growing, but long-lived and requires little care once established.

Calendula Deja Vu



Generous with their daisy-like, bright flowers in shades of pink, orange, yellow, and burnt orange-cream. Some blooms sport contrasting dark lower petals and darker tips. Tolerates full sun or partial shade, grows to about 20-inches tall and will continue to bloom all summer with deadheading. The petals, removed from the flower base, are edible and provide a cheery confetti to salads, grains, and even deserts. Flavor is tangy and slightly sweet. An excellent cut flower.

Castor Bean - Carmencita Red



Fast-growing with iridescent wine-colored foliage, red stems, bright red pods. Can be grown in large containers. Brilliantly colored seed pods make an exotic cut flower. Perennial in zones 8-10.

Castor Bean - New Zealand Purple



A unique and uncommon variety, the New Zealand castor bean plant has enormous, deeply lobed, rich metallic bronze-purple leaves that seems to shimmer in the sun. One of the more showy specimens, its foliage, stems, and even seed pods are a deep purple. This variety will grow to 6- to 8-feet tall and produce red blooms in late summer and early fall. Grown as a big leafy specimen or as background plants, this lovely castor bean variety will add a fabulous tropical dimension to your garden. Seeds are highly poisonous.

Castor Bean - Rícinus Communis



A specimen foliage plant that is exotic, magnificent and tropical in appearance. Grows to 6 to 10 feet and bears large, deep green leaves embossed with deep red veins. Produces bright pink flower buds and attractive bright pink seed pods which add dramatic flare to the landscape.

Chilean Glory Flower



A quick growing, climber with dark fern-like foliage and twining tendrils will scurry up your fence, trellis, or arbor forming a lacy, exotic canopy or useful screen. It bears continual clusters of 1-inch, yellowy-orange tubular blooms which are hummingbird magnets!

Sparkler Blush Cleome



This dwarf hybrid Spider Flower yields tremendous blooms over a very long season. Plants reach only 3-feet tall, are bushier and more windtolerant than standard Cleomes. The 4-to 6-inch flowers of Sparkler Blush are airy and spidery in hues of pink brushed with white. They hold well on the plant and are wonderfully long-lasting as cut flowers.

White Queen Cleome



An old fashioned favorite, also known as Spider Flower, cleome's large airy flowers bloom atop sturdy 4 foot stalks. A very stately centerpiece in the garden or as a cut flower for large arrangements. If pinched when about 6 inches tall, each plant will branch out to produce a half dozen or more blooms. A bright clean white.

víolet Queen Cleome



An old fashioned favorite, also known as Spider Flower, cleome's large airy flowers bloom atop sturdy 4 foot stalks. A very stately centerpiece in the garden or as a cut flower for large arrangements. If pinched when about 6 inches tall, each plant will branch out to produce a half dozen or more blooms. Cosmíc Orange Cosmos



An All-America Winner sure to thrive in any garden. Free flowering with a well branched habit, but compact enough for small gardens. Lacy foliage and silky flowers give an airy touch to the garden from midsummer to frost. Wonderful for outting. Grows best in full sun.

Sea Shells Cosmos

These bright, colorful 3-inch blooms on tall stems with typical ferny cosmos foliage are a real eyecatcher in any garden. The tubular petals with fluted edges in creamy and pastel shades of white, pink, rose and carmine lend both an elegant and charming effect that is two-toned and threedimensional. This Mexican native, loved by butterflies, is ideal for a cutting garden or mixed border.

Craspedía Sun Ball



Commonly known as Billy Button or Drumstick, the striking golden-yellow blooms of this wildflower native to New Zealand and Australia make a great addition to bouquets. The 1-inch globes sit atop long, stiff stems amidst grass-like, silvery green foliage. Long vase-life as a cut flower, and retains vivid color when dried.

Echinacea Cheyenne Spirit



A stunning first-year flowering echinacea with hues ranging from rich purple to pink, red, salmon, yellows, creams and white. The abundant flowers grace the top of well branched, durable plants. Well suited to your perennial border, a mass landscape planting, a butterfly garden or as a cut flower.

Little Hobbit Bear Skin Fescue



This very attractive, dwarf clumping grass thrives on neglect! With soft, emerald green leaves, this evergreen perennial is ideally suited for the front of borders, as ground cover, or in rock gardens. Will tolerate full sun or part-shade.

Four O'clock Lemon Swirl



This lovely four o'clock has lemon-yellow, white, and bicolor, funnel-shaped blooms with a sweet, citrus fragrance. While the flowers close up in the heat of day, they open in the early evening, stay open all night and will be there to great you each and every summer morning.

Four O'clock Marbles Mix



This collection produces a sweep of striped and marbled, trumpet-shaped flowers splashed with hues of pink, rose, red, orange, and yellow. Like all four o'clocks, they open in the evening, suffusing the air with a delightful, orangeblossom scent. Place them strategically in your garden to enjoy the sweet evening perfume.

Gomphrena Fireworks



This unique cultivar grows to form a full, dense, specimen, reaching to 3- to 4-feet tall and 1-to 2-feet wide. Countless strong, tall stems are topped with exploding bursts of 1-inch hot iridescent pink blossoms tipped with tiny, bright yellow flowers. More blooms per plant than other Gomphrenas, coupled with the explosion of color in its unusual "scaffolding" habit make Fireworks a showstopper in the garden and a conversation piece when cut for a mixed bouquet. This drought-tolerant and extremely low-maintenance treasure will reward you for the season.

Gomphrena Globe Amaranth



Globe amaranth is a non-stop performer! Wellbranched, upright plants continuously produce clover-like pom pom blooms all summer long. A classic favorite that thrives in hot conditions, and its long-lasting flowers are superb for cutting and dried arrangements.

Gomphrena Strawberry Fields



Strawberry Fields is a little-known treasure that sports unusually deep, clear red flowers that resemble bright red strawberries with tiny yellow "seeds." The neat, everlasting, clover-like, flowers sit atop 2-foot straight stems with narrow, gray-green leaves from summer to early fall. Like other Gomphrena, Strawberry Fields is heat tolerant, great for bedding, borders, cutting and drying.

Hyacinth Bean Ruby Moon



Award-winner with color all season. Green and wine-colored foliage, purple stems, lilac-rose blossoms and shiny, magenta pods (2-3"). While all parts of the plant are edible, it is recommended that the mature seeds be boiled before eating; used in Asian, Thai and Indian cooking. Useful as cut flowers; pods may also be dried.

Iresene Purple Lady



A low-growing annual trailer with cascades of bright cranberry and dark burgundy leaves and stems. The perfect choice for a splash of vivid color in your mixed containers, hanging baskets, or as a ground cover in the landscape. Well-suited for both partial sun and shade.

Lobelía Vulcan Red



The deep bronze foliage of this perennial forms a columnar, upright clump, topped with spikes of striking rich, fiery, cardinal red flowers from midsummer into early fall. This tall, showy, native cultivar is particularly effective when massed and the tubular flowers are a favorite of hummingbirds and butterflies.

The largest of all the Nicotianas, the stately plant grows up to 5-feet tall. Bold, basal foliage is topped with clusters of pendulous pristine white intensely fragrant blooms. Only the Lonely deserves a place near a door, a kitchen window, or under your bedroom window where you can best enjoy the rich Jasmine-like perfume during the night.

Pínk Feather Pampas Grass



This showy ornamental grass will create a spectacular, dramatic statement when planted in your garden. The fresh green foliage is topped by long, thick, elegant dusty-pink plumes late summer through fall. The plumes are often cut and dried for indoor use, or they can be left on the plant for wonderful winter interest. A truly elegant specimen for your landscape.

Ideal for hanging baskets, window boxes, and containers.

Petunía 'Dolcissima Flambe'



This Fleuroselect Quality Mark Winner is an Italian grandiflora cultivar. Brilliant, 3-inch, ruffled blooms suffused with shades of rose, lemon, and cream are held profusely over compact 10-inch plants. Expect masses of blooms in which no two petals are identical. The ideal choice for window boxes, hanging baskets, containers, or the front of a mixed border.

California Poppy Jelly Beans'



Fully double blooms in vibrant, irresistible colors of bubblegum pink, creamy yellow, tangerine, and raspberry red glisten above a mass of feathery bluegreen foliage. While dainty in appearance, these annuals are tough, hardy, and thrive on neglect in poor, dry soils. The brilliant papery flowers are equally enticing to onlookers and pollinators.

Purple Love Grass



A perennial, warm season, native bunchgrass ideal for providing year-round interest to the landscape. Flat, coarse, green blades form a disorganized clump of foliage that typically rises to 10-inches tall. During the August bloom, florets form a fluffy and airy, reddish-purple cloud, lending a soothing purple haze and irresistible texture to the landscape. The light green summer foliage then transitions to a bronzy-red in the fall. Like other ornamental grasses, if allowed to persist, this Love Grass will continue to provide visual interest through the winter.

Purple Prairie Clover



This long-blooming, native, perennial, wildflower can add a unique structural element to a mixed border or variety to an existing naturalization or meadow. Intensely red-violet flowers, with orangetipped stamens around a central cone, punctuate the stiff, upright stems. Like other legumes, this perennial which reaches 3-feet tall at maturity, is invaluable in the fixation of Nitrogen, maintaining the fertility of your garden soils for years to come.

Royal Catchfly



Also known as Prairie Fire, this distinctive wildflower bears small clusters of brilliant, scarlet red, 2-inch flowers in mid-summer. Each bloom consists of five narrow, widely spaced, notched petals. As numerous flowers open at the same time, the result is a showy crimson display adorned by hummingbirds and butterflies.

Rudbeckía 'Cherry Brandy'



After growing Cherry Brandy, you'll never look at Rudbeckia the same way again! This powerhouse of a plant stands two feet tall and sends up dozens of velvety, long-lasting blooms in rich shades of red and mahogany with the trademark big black eye. The butterflies, bees, songbirds and neighbors alike will pay their respects and savor this old-fashioned favorite. Superb for cut flowers and dramatic in arrangements and bouquets.

Rudbeckía 'Chím Chíminee'



This mid-sized variety is a standout due to its very unusual narrow or quilled petals surrounding a brown cone. Flowers are in rustic shades of yellow, gold, orange and mahogany red. A mass of blooms from July to frost. Half-hardy perennial. Often survives a few winters, or at least self seeds.

Rudbeckía 'Goldílocks'



This exceptional Rudbeckia has a dense branching compact habit, sweet double and semi-double, 4-inch golden-orange, blooms surrounding a dark deep-set eye. Expect ongoing flowering from midsummer to the first frost. A low-maintenance and carefree beauty that makes an outstanding cut flower.

Rudbeckía 'Praíríe Sun'



A 2003 All America Selection. Quite different in appearance from other Rudbeckias. It has a light green center with sunny yellow petals edged with a lighter shade of yellow. Plants grow to about 3' in height and blooms can be as large as 5" across. Can provide high quality cut flowers. Half-hardy perennial. Often survives a few winters, or at least self seeds.

Runner Bean 'Golden Sunshine'



An ornamental and edible, runner bean with glowing chartreuse leaves accentuated by scarlet-red flowers. The 6 to 8 foot vines produce loads of flat, green, tasty pods. Harvest as "snaps" when 4 to 6 inches long with beans just beginning to form in the pods; or, allow the seed to mature further for shell or dried use. A truly vibrant climbing specimen that will tolerate some cool, partially shaded areas better than other types of beans. Choose your perfect spot and let the magic unfold.

Sneezeweed



Don't let the name Sneezweed scare you away from this stunning bloomer. The name's origin lies in the Native Americans historical use of the plant to make snuff. Today, the numerous clusters of 2-inch, badminton-birdie shaped, yellow flowers of this Helenium can provide welcome color in late summer and fall garden when many other blooms have disappeared. This perennial typically grows 3- to 5-feet tall and can provide some nice vertical height to the mixed border.

Strawflower Dwarf Míx



Compact plants bear attractive, papery flowers that provide glorious summer color and are among the best everlastings for winter bouquets. Splendid shades of red, yellow, salmon, rose, violet and white bloom continuously from midsummer until frost. Tolerates poor soil, heat, and drought.

Italian White Sunflower



A.k.a. Italian Greenheart, this unique multibranching sunflower has creamy white, daisy-like, pointed petals with contrasting green to black centers. Grows 4 to 6 feet tall.

Lemon Eclair Sunflower



This eye-catching cultivar reaches 4-feet tall, has branching habit, with 4-inch distinctively double, lemon-colored blooms, with chocolate brown centers. Lemon Eclair are pollen free, making for a messfree cut flower.

Sole D Oro Sunflower



These branching, 4-foot tall plants are covered with large, golden yellow, fully double blooms from July through the season's end.

Tassel Flower 'Irísh Poet'



RARE - The rediscovered light orange form of tassel flower, almost lost in the last 20 years. Little tufted paintbrush blossoms dance on the tops of curvy stems. Great in masses, or weaving among other annuals. Self sows.

Torch Tithonia



Best Tithonia for cutting. Flowers are 3 1/2 inches wide on strong branching plants with velvety dark green leaves. Blooms midsummer to frost. Loves hot dry sites. Once you have Tithonia in your garden, it's hard to live without!
