A floriferous and drought tolerant addition to your containers and borders. Stunning when combined with dark red or bronze-leaved plants. Like all Agastache, attractive to both bees, butterflies and hummingbirds.</p>		
<b>Agastache 'Arizona Sun'</b>  <p>In the sensational new Arizona series, Arizona Sun is a compact and uniform, 10-inch plant, with bright sunny yellow, mint-scented tubular flowers. Blooms in abundance throughout summer and into the fall. Hummingbirds and other pollinators love this carefree and drought tolerant plant.</p>	<b>Agastache 'Astello Indigo'</b>  <p>Indulge your senses with 'Astello Indigo' — fabulous dark, green, mint-scented foliage, layered with long-lasting, stately, deep blue flower spikes. Irresistible to bees and butterflies, a spectacle when planted en masse in landscapes, and a great pop of blue for your containers. A long-lasting bloomer that will not disappoint.</p>		
<b>Agastache 'Fragrant Delight'</b>  <p>A kaleidoscope of brilliant colors garnish this lovely delight. Tubular raspberry, lilac and orange flowers in summer and fall sit atop a lacy, fragrant leaves on bushy 2 foot tall plants. Best if given a bit of shade to protect the foliage color. This 30-inch looker is a pollinator's dream! Gardeners love it too!</p>		
<b>Agastache 'Heather Queen'</b>  <p>This 30-inch Hyssop will reward you with a long-lasting display of large, dark-pink flower spikes atop gray-green aromatic foliage. Hummingbirds and other pollinators love this carefree and drought tolerant plant.</p>	<b>Agastache 'Kiowa Sunset'</b>  <p>This Fleuroselect Award Winner offers a rich display of buttery-yellow, tubular flowers amidst deep-green aromatic foliage. A heavy bloomer from June to October, these 18-inch, bushy plants will delight both you and the pollinators. A wonderful addition to borders and containers.</p>		
<b>Agastache 'Licorice Blue'</b>  <p>An exceptional performer in the sun-drenched garden. Bees, butterflies and hummingbirds love to sample the nectar rich blooms of these tall bushy plants. The lacy umbrellas atop strong sturdy stems reach up to 4-feet tall, open chaste white, change to soft pink and finally deepen to a rich rose-red. A delicate filler for your perennial beds and borders that provides a lovely everlasting for your arrangements and bouquets.</p>	<b>Anemone hupehensis 'Pink Saucer'</b>  <p>This easy to grow perennial with a mounding habit, also known as Japanese Anemone or windflower, sports attractive ball-shaped buds that morph into graceful, 2½-inch silvery, rose-pink blossoms frolicking atop 36-inch, wiry stems. One of the earliest summer-flowering Anemone, beginning their show in July and carrying on their display well into the fall. A treasure in the border and great for cut bouquets.</p>

## Asclepias Tuberosa 'Butterfly Weed'



Commonly known as Butterfly Weed, Asclepias is a drought tolerant, native perennial with magnificent bright orange flowers concentrated in compact clusters atop branching stems. A non-stop bloomer from midsummer to autumn, the brightly colored flower clusters are followed by fruit and showy seed. The perfect choice for attracting butterflies and beneficial insects to your garden.

## Bachelor's Button 'Classic Romantic'



This Fleuroselect Novelty Award Winner, is a delightful mix of single and semi-double flowers in blends of blush, pink, white, and carmine, with numerous bi-color combinations of each. Every bloom of this easy-to-grow, cottage garden plant is unique! Blooms may be harvested for fresh or dried bouquets, or as decorative edibles atop salads and pastries. Plants grow 2½- to 3-foot tall and bloom from late spring to late summer if regularly harvested. Add a little romance to your garden!

## Bells of Ireland



This showy 2- to 3-foot tall plant produces blossom spikes of papery, apple green, bell-shaped calyxes enveloping small white flowers. An extremely long-lasting and striking addition to both cut and dried arrangements. In the vase, it's a perfect foil for more brightly colored annuals whilst adding form, structure, and interest in its own right. A self-sower that can usually be relied upon for years of successive blooms.

## Blackberry Lily



This uncommon, easy-care perennial, too seldom seen in American gardens, features the foliage of an Iris, the blooms of a Lily, and unusual glossy black berries that form in clusters when its seedpods split open in fall. Long-blooming and very easy to grow, it is a fine addition to any planting. The jazzy, unusual blooms arriving mid-summer are borne at the end of long, wiry stems, reach 2 inches wide and have a rich orange base and liberal scarlet speckles. Fascinating to behold in the garden and often brought indoors for arrangements.

## Calendula 'Pacific Apricot Beauty'



This lovely old-fashioned variety features many-petaled flowers in warm apricot, brushed with creamy yellow, held atop tall stems. The edible petals and flowers are lovely strewn across a summer salad, and are a great add to breads and healing balms. The blooms of this 2-foot tall plant are also ideal cut flowers.

## Calendula 'Pink Surprise'



Peachy-pink, double-flowered, frilly, 2 to 3 inch blooms on strong stems make 'Pink Surprise' an excellent candidate for both fresh and dried floral arrangements. The tangy petals of this self-sower are also edible — sprinkle on salads, decorate cakes or feed them to chickens to produce dark colored yolks.

## Calendula 'Sunset Buff'



Petals of this unstoppable bloomer are warm, and a subtle blend of apricot and buff with crimson backs. The cheerful, 2½-inch plants are delightful in borders and make a stunning cut flower. Clip spent flowers to achieve a longer blooming season.

## Calendula 'Zeolights'



Selected out of the "Flashback" line of Calendulas, with red petal backs, Zeolights has huge fully doubled pale, peachy and bronze colored blooms atop 18- to 24-inch stems. Pointed petals emanate from a darker center and have a unique, elegant, layered quality that really make this bloom a standout.

## Castor Bean 'New Zealand Purple'



A unique and uncommon variety, the New Zealand castor bean plant has enormous, deeply lobed, rich metallic bronze-purple leaves that seems to shimmer in the sun. One of the more showy specimens, its foliage, stems, and even seed pods are a deep purple. This variety will grow to 6- to 8-foot tall and produce red blooms in late summer and early fall. Grown as a big leafy specimen or as background plants, this lovely castor bean variety will add a fabulous tropical dimension to your garden. Seeds are highly poisonous.

## White Queen Cleome



An old fashioned favorite, also known as Spider Flower, cleome's large airy flowers bloom atop sturdy 4 foot stalks. A very stately centerpiece in the garden or as a cut flower for large arrangements. If pinched when about 6 inches tall, each plant will branch out to produce a half dozen or more blooms. A bright clean white.

### Cosmos Double Click Cranberries



Tall plants with strong stems support fully double and semidouble, 2- to 3-inch, ruffled, rich, carmine blooms. A wonderful addition to the cutting garden or flower border. Breathtaking in bouquets.

### Double Click Rose Bon Bon



Tall and very floriferous with 2- to 3-inch, fluffy and frilly, fully double rosy-lavender blooms. Perfect for cutting abundant bouquets all summer long.

### Double Click Snow Puff Cosmos

### Sonata White Cosmos

### Echinacea Baby Swan White



This award winning, compact, well-branched hybrid grows to just 20 inches tall. Eye-catching, vintage, burnished-white, reflexed petals surround a bronze core on these boastful 5-inch blooms from June to September. And to seal the deal, this beauty is a wildlife magnet — the nectar and seeds are irresistible to native insects, butterflies and songbirds.

### Echinacea Cheyenne Spirit



A stunning first-year flowering echinacea with hues ranging from rich purple to pink, red, salmon, yellows, creams and white. The abundant flowers grace the top of well branched, durable plants. Well suited to your perennial border, a mass landscape planting, a butterfly garden or as a cut flower.

### Echinacea Double Decker



It is hard to smile when you see these fanciful blooms of this 36-inch tall looker. A classic skirt of deep, rosy-pink reflexed petals radiates from beneath this cone flower, while a playful cluster of shorter petals is perched atop. First year plants sometimes produce single flowers, then moving forward a high percentage of two-tiered flowers appear. Like all coneflowers, Double Decker is a reliable, trouble-free perennial that tolerates sun, heat and drought.

### Echinacea Green Twister



A lively lemon-green coneflower bearing a unique red-pink halo around its center that darkens to carmine as it matures. Carefree and drought-tolerant, this garden workhorse reaches 3½ feet tall and will bear hundreds of lush blooms over its many months of color. The playful hues will energize your mid to late summer borders and add a playful pop to your cut-flower arrangements!

### Gomphrena Globosa Qis Pastel Mix



This late summer darling thrives in heat and is delightful both in the garden and the vase. A cut-and-come-again workhorse with charming button-like blossoms in a mix of white, rose, soft pink and pale lilac. The clover-like blossoms atop uniform stems are perfect for both your fresh and dried bouquets.

### Gomphrena haageana Qis Sunset Mix



This late summer darling thrives in heat and is delightful both in the garden and the vase. A cut-and-come-again workhorse with button-like blossoms in a mix of orange, carmine and cherry add a bright pop of color to your summer gardens and arrangements. The clover-like blossoms atop uniform stems are perfect for both your fresh and dried bouquets.

### Hyacinth Bean 'Ruby Moon'

While all parts of the plant are edible, it is recommended that the mature seeds be boiled before eating; used in Asian, Thai and Indian cooking. Useful as cut flowers; pods may also be dried.

### Leonitis nepetifolia 'Staircase'



Also known as Klip Dagga and Lion's Ear, this African native is magnificent! Bright orange tubular blooms form showy, whorled tufted clusters at regular intervals along tall stems from July to October providing a nectar rich feast for bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. Stunning en masse and eye-catching both in the back of your borders and as a focal flower in bouquets.

### French Vanilla Hybrid Marigold



A triumph in plant breeding, this hybrid churns out a bounty of long-lasting, nearly odorless, 3-inch, creamy-white blooms! The 24-inch plants are a refreshing contrast to bright summer colors and are versatile garden players — grouped as low hedge, accents for your larger containers or as a cut-and-come again bloomers for your bouquet garden.

### Lemon Gem Marigold



Hundreds of petite, edible, golden flowers cover neat, low mounds of lacy foliage with a citrusy scent. When planted in trios, these long bloomers give the thick, rounded appearance of a small flowering shrub. Not only great for beds, borders and containers, the fragrant edible excels as a companion in the vegetable garden to repel unwanted guests.

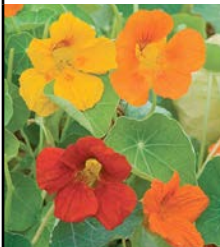

### Crimson Emperor Nasturtium



This gem will reward you with an endless supply of consistently rich crimson, golden-throated blooms. Habit of this hummingbird magnet is less trailing, more lax and bushy — making a spectacular spreading ground cover. An abundance of leaves and flowers to add extra zing to your salad!

### Gleam Mix Nasturtium



This All-American winner is a trailer, ideal for hanging baskets and moderate spreading, with vines that are substantially longer than Jewel Mix. Large double and semi-double blooms in creams, yellows, orange and reds will brighten up your pots and borders from midsummer until frost. The flowers and young leaves are edible with a spicy, peppery flavor akin to watercress. Great as a garnish or for adding zip to your salads!

### Jewel Mix Nasturtium



A nice compact 15 to 18-inch plant with bright, colorful double blooms in yellow, orange and deep red held above light green foliage. Will reward you with blooms until frost. Both leaves and flowers are edible with a peppery zing.

### Ladybird Cream Purple Spot Nasturtium



This compact, molding variety is covered in unique, warm and creamy blooms with raspberry flanked throats. These dwarf beauties, ideal for containers or small gardens, are of the longest flowering nasturtiums — flowering vigorously through to the first frost. Both leaves and flowers are edible with a peppery zing.

### Nasturtium Variegated Queen



Noteworthy for their attractive, white variegated foliage and beautiful flowers in a full range of color. Both leaves and flowers are edible with a peppery zing.

### Nasturtium Whirlybird Mix



Among the earliest blooming nasturtiums, this cheerful mix will become a fast favorite! Whirlybird boasts a gorgeous array of cherry, tangerine, scarlet, mahogany, lemon and creamy 2- to 3-inch, semi-double blooms that hold their faces straight up and well above the dark green compact foliage, for a "look-at-me" kind of display. Easily adaptable to your baskets, containers, beds and borders. Both leaves and flowers are edible with a peppery zing.

### Nicotiana Langsdorfii 'Lemon Tree'



This striking Nicotiana has 3- to 4-foot tall stems sporting an array of pendulous, bell-shaped, lemony-chartreuse flowers. Easy companion plant in your borders as the color of 'Lemon Tree' so readily combines with others. Will also not disappoint you as a cut-flower. Intense evening fragrance is a bonus!

### Nicotiana 'Marshmallow'



This visually stunning cultivar of flowering tobacco will add stature, grace and fragrance to your summer borders. Large basal leaves give rise to masses of 24-inch stems topped with sweetly scented tubular flowers. The flowers fade through red, pink, and white to give the effect of a beautiful pastel tri-color plant. Pollinators, including hummingbirds, love it.

### Nicotiana 'Only the Lonely'



Winner of the RHS Award of Garden Merit, this beloved cultivar, also known as Woodland Tobacco, is a stunning accent plant. The largest of all the Nicotianas, the stately plant grows up to 5-feet tall. Bold, basal foliage is topped with clusters of pendulous pristine white intensely fragrant blooms. Only the Lonely deserves a place near a door, a kitchen window, or under your bedroom window where you can best enjoy the rich jasmine-like perfume during the night.

### Orlaya grandiflora 'White Lace'



This care-free member of the carrot family adds a delicate airiness and unmatched elegance to summer borders and fresh bouquets. Lush fern-like foliage and intricate, 2½- to 3½-inch pure white, graceful, lacy flowers stand atop strong upright stems within a full, well-branched 24- to 30-inch plant. The clusters of star-shaped, green seed pods also make a unique bouquet addition.

### Petunia 'Dolcissima Flambe'



This Fleuroselect Quality Mark winner is an Italian grandiflora cultivar. Brilliant, 3-inch, ruffled blooms suffused with shades of rose, lemon, and cream are held profusely over compact 10-inch plants. Expect masses of blooms in which no two petals are identical. The ideal choice for window boxes, hanging baskets, containers, or the front of a mixed border.

### Petunia 'Sparklers Mix'



This Petunia garnering the Fleuroselect Novelty Award is entirely unique. Both the flowers and the greens are pointed, yielding perfectly star-shaped petunias amidst graceful, tapered foliage. This dynamic blend combines pinks, violets and purples, from pastel to deep jewel tones, and bicolors. These mounding 12-inch plants put on a magnificent display whether cascading out of hanging baskets or planted in borders and beds.

## Black Swan Poppy



Black Swan is too gorgeous to tuck away in a menagerie of other flowers. Sow it along a path you frequent, near your deck or patio, or in a large container where you can watch the frilly, rich cabernet colored, 3 to 5 inch semi-double blossoms unfurl. Harvest blooms for exquisite bouquets or simply enjoy the show! Plants reach 24 to 36 inches tall and will self sow.

## Corn Poppy



Papaver Rhoeas, also known as Flander's Poppy, is the beloved and classic red poppy, captured by Van Gogh and Monet and seen sweeping fields throughout Europe — most notably Flander's Field. Brilliant red flowers perch atop branching 3-foot stems. Expect these cheerful bloomers to self-sow for new growth in succeeding seasons. A sight to behold en masse!

## Poppy 'Feathered Mix'



The deeply cut petals of this poppy form frilly and spirited pompons of blooms in purple, red, white, pink, and lavender. The early summer, colorful array is accentuated by steel blue foliage on this 2- to 3-foot tall plant. Self sows.

## Hen & Chicks Breadseed Poppy



Ooh la la! For the first act Hen & Chicks flaunts, showy, enormous, single blooms, up to 8 inches across, with paper thin, rich pinky-lilac petals and darker purple centers. These then give way to breathtaking large pods (hens) surrounded by a wreath of many smaller pods (chicks). Plants grow up to 3-foot tall. The pods are a spectacular addition to dried arrangements.

## Pandora Poppy



Bound to be a show-stopper in your gardens, this beauty resembling antique silk showcases double blossoms with silvery stripes in magnificent shades ranging from dusky rose to burgundy. With a little dead-heading, the floral extravaganza of this 18- to 24-inch poppy will continue from early to late summer!

## Purple Love Grass



A perennial, warm season, native bunchgrass ideal for providing year-round interest to the landscape. Flat, coarse, green blades form a disorganized clump of foliage that typically rises to 10-inches tall. During the August bloom, florets form a fluffy and airy, reddish-purple cloud, lending a soothing purple haze and irresistible texture to the landscape. The light green summer foliage then transitions to a bronzy-red in the fall. Like other ornamental grasses, if allowed to persist, this Love Grass will continue to provide visual interest through the winter.

## Rudbeckia 'Cherokee Sunset'



While it blooms all summer long, this 24- to 30-inch tall All-America Selections winner appeals to

## Rudbeckia 'Gloriosa Double Daisy'



This tall strain of Rudbeckia yields a profusion of rich, golden yellow 3 1/2-inch flowers with large, black centers on sturdy 3-foot stems. Treat as a half-hardy perennial, but expect some self seeding will occur. Outstanding as an annual cut-flower!

## Rudbeckia 'Maya'



A Fleuroselect Gold Medal Winner that delivers fully-double, golden-yellow flowers from early summer until frost. The 4-inch wide, chrysanthemum-like blooms emerge from a care-free, compact, dwarf 18-inch plant and make exceptional cut flowers.

## Rudbeckia 'Prairie Sun'



A 2003 All America Selection. Quite different in appearance from other Rudbeckias. It has a light green center with sunny yellow petals edged with a lighter shade of yellow. Plants grow to about 3' in height and blooms can be as large as 5" across. Can provide high quality cut flowers. Half-hardy perennial. Often survives a few winters, or at least self seeds.

### Rudbeckia 'Sahara'



A moody twist on a classic garden favorite! Semi-double and double flowers in unique shades of antique rusty-rose, soft pink-red, pale-lemon, apricot and copper bloom dependably from midsummer to fall on 20- to 24-inch tall strong stems. Dependable blooms beginning midsummer make this pick not only worthy for your beds and borders, but an excellent cut!

### Runner Bean 'Golden Sunshine'



An ornamental and edible, runner bean with glowing chartreuse leaves accentuated by scarlet-red flowers. The 6 to 8 foot vines produce loads of flat, green, tasty pods. Harvest as "snaps" when 4 to 6 inches long with beans just beginning to form in the pods; or, allow the seed to mature further for shell or dried use. 
